Governor's Proclamation 20-28

(Open Public Meetings Act (OPMA) and the Public Records Act (PRA)

(1) Temporarily suspends OPMA language requiring agencies to provide a physical location for the public to attend meetings in-person. While the public must continue to be permitted to attend the meetings, they can

attend <u>only remotely (not in-person</u>).

(2) Temporarily suspends other OPMA provisions requiring in-person activities or otherwise requiring a

physical location or meeting activities related to a physical location/site or meeting room.

(3) Temporarily suspends the ability of an agency to take "action" on matters at a meeting **unless** they are:

(a) matters necessary and routine, or (b) necessary to respond to the outbreak and current public health emergency.
