Centralized laboratory


- Servicing the whole state
- Provide alcohol and comprehensive drug testing
 - Death investigation cases
 - Suspected impaired driving cases
 - Suspected drug-facilitated crimes/drug-involved cases
 - Sexual assaults
 - Child endangerment
 - Homicides
 - LCB cases

5500 5000 4500 2011 2012 2013 2014 2015 2016 2017 2018 2019 2020



2020 Accomplishments

Number of cases in backlog:

decreased by 2,000 cases

Median turnaround time for DUI cases:

decreased from 303 to 200 days

2020 Supplemental Budget

Overall Request: \$3.597 M Operational budget \$1.828 M Transportation budget

Permanent Personnel (x 7):

• 3 forensic scientists (transferred 3 project FTE's)

• 1 laboratory technician (*transferred 1 project FTE*)


- 2 technical lead scientists
- 1 office assistant

Temporary Outsourcing (18 months):

- 85% of death investigation cases (~ 5,550 cases)
- 1 forensic scientist (FS2) (will not fill)

Secondary facility:

- ~ 10 year lease in south King County (*"The Sanctuary"*, *Federal Way*)
- ~ 4 instruments (purchase early 2021)

Grant funding

Continue to rely on grant funding:

- WSTC
 - Instrumentation (*TOF-MS*, *LCMSMS*, 3 x *HSGC* for second lab)
 - Scientist position (*FS2*)
 - Outsourcing specialty testing for DUI cases
 - Blood evidence kits for DUI investigations
- Coverdell
 - Blood evidence kits for death investigations

Changing scope of drugs

Designer Benzodiazepines

Illicit formulations based on the structure of FDA approved drugs

Flualprazolam – first reported instance in 2017 Began appearing in WSP Tox case work in 2019

2020: Fifth most prevalent drug in DUI case work

Developed and Validated a new method to detect 31 new designer benzos
