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Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

- Information from Governor's Highway Safety Association
- Current Continuing Resolution until October 31
- Highway safety general fund (Section 402) increase 27%
- Highway safety priority program (Section 405) increase 31%





Moving Equity Forward

- Reduce Racial Profiling (Section 1906) increased award to \$1.5 M
 - Removes two year limit on receiving funding
 - Adds programs, public outreach, and training costs





Moving Equity Forward

- NHTSA must evaluate nonenforcement based countermeasures
- State's Highway Safety Plans must include meaningful public participation and engagement from communities most impacted by traffic deaths and serious injuries
- Traffic Safety Enforcement Programs must foster effective community collaboration







Section 402 Changes

 Highway Safety Improvement Plans and Highway Safety Plans can no longer set increasing targets

 Authorizes 402 funding for automated enforcement in school and work zones

Section 405 Changes

- Increased share of non-motorized funding
- New: Preventing Roadside Deaths
- New: Driver and Officer Traffic Stop Training
- Additional allowable uses for traffic records, impairment, and nonmotorized funding







164 Penalty Transfer

 Removed the limitation on spending Section 164 funds on alcohol-only projects by adding "alcohol- or multiple substance- impairment"

Additional Funding

- \$5 billion for local governments to implement Vision Zero programs
- \$1.5 million for new vehicle recall awareness grant programs
- \$300 million for new crash data programs
