



## **Tumwater Middle School Survey Results**

## **Observation Notes**

Observations were collected near the entrances to the school on Littlerock Rd. SW from Bishop Rd. SW. Flashing beacons with signage indicate the active school zone. Littlerock Rd. SW is a two-way road split by a landscaped center median with sidewalks on both sides. There are marked crosswalks on both ends of the school with school crossing signs. The school is mid-block between two roundabout intersections.



## **Survey results show:**

- ⇒ Despite traffic slowing roundabouts at both ends, and school zone flashing beacons, the majority of drivers observed exceeded the 20 mph school zone speed limit.
- ⇒ Most speeding drivers were traveling 26-30 mph in the active school zone.
- ⇒ One of every five speeding drivers were traveling greater than 30 mph in the active school zone.
- ⇒ Ten school bus drivers were observed and all were traveling greater than 20 mph. Two were observed traveling 31-35 mph, which is also in excess of the regular posted speed limit.
- Drivers passing the school were much more likely to be speeding than drivers entering the school.
