Washington Traffic Safety Survey Summary Report 2024

September 2024

This project is an effort of the Washington State Traffic Safety Commission (WTSC). The purpose of the work is to understand more about drivers' attitudes and behaviors towards safety of the traveling public and help WTSC inform new initiatives to reduce traffic fatalities and serious injuries.

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Methodology

Background

The Washington State Traffic Safety Commission (WTSC) sponsored the Traffic Safety Survey to understand more about drivers' attitudes and behaviors towards safety of the traveling public and help WTSC inform new initiatives to reduce traffic fatalities and serious injuries.

Sample

The survey involved a statewide sample of Washington respondents ages 18 and older. An address-based sampling frame (ABS) was developed of 34,000 randomly selected households in the state. The sample was stratified by WTSC's seventeen Target Zero Regions. Less populous regions were oversampled with the goal of providing reliable annual estimates for all Target Zero Regions. The ABS was combined with an online panel sample that was used to boost overall completes and fill in under-responding groups. All survey participants were screened for eligibility at the start of the survey. Screening criteria included age, county, and state of residence.

Data Collection

Data collection involved a multi-mode push-to-web/pen-and-paper personal interview (PAPI). For the ABS sample, an initial letter was mailed to sampled households inviting them to participate in an online survey. A follow-up postcard and final letter were mailed to non-responding households. Finally, a paper survey was mailed to those not responding to the online survey. Data collection was split into three waves and occurred from March 1st to August 2nd, 2024. A total of 10,559 respondents completed the survey, passed all data verification checks, and were retained in the final dataset. 5,879 respondents were from the ABS sample and 4,680 from the online panel.

Survey Instrument

The final survey included 104 questions and was designed and validated by WTSC and Montana State University. The survey contained questions about driving behavior, driving history, pedestrians and bicyclists, driving rules, driving and traffic safety, and opinions and expectations. The survey was conducted in English and Spanish.

Methodology

Weighting

The final dataset included mixed records from probability (PS) and non-probability (NPS) samples. The non-probability sample was provided by online web panels and was not randomly generated. The weighting procedure was conducted in concordance with recommendations from Elliot and Valliant (2017) using propensity weighting or quasi-randomization approach.

Propensity Weighting

Propensity weighting is used to balance the covariate distributions to match those of a probability sample, which is used as a reference. Under this approach, we fit a statistical model to estimate the inclusion probability of the nonprobability units, and then use the predicted probabilities to derive the nonprobability sample weights or pseudo weights.

The data was weighted to match the profile of the target population based on their area of residence, gender, age, race/ethnicity, and income. The first phase in the process of weighting the survey data involved imputing any missing values from key demographic variables including age, gender, race/ethnicity, and income.

The following steps were taken to weight the data:

1) Estimate propensity scores

We first created a dichotomous variable, Y, which is coded 1 for probability sample units and 0 for nonprobability sample units; then we fit a classification model with Y as the response variable. MDR used a decision tree model for this step.

Decision trees were used because they often outperform logistic regression model and are more flexible in terms of dealing with outliers and multicollinearity. Predictor variables in the model include all demographic variables (age, gender, region, etc.), socioeconomic variables (income, education, etc.) and other attitudinal/behavioral variables included in the survey.

Finally, we used the predicted propensities as the estimated inclusion probabilities (p) for the nonprobability sample units; **these pseudo-base weights are calculated as:**

$$BW=1/(1-p)$$

Methodology

Weighting (cont'd)

2) Compute probability base weights and non-response adjustments

The probability sample weights are computed as the inverse of the predicted inclusion probabilities:

$$BW(i) = N(i) / S(i)$$

Where N is the universe count for each region i . And S is the sampled count for each region i .

Non-response adjustments are assigned separately to each record from the purchased list. These weights are equal to:

$$NR(i) = S(i) / n(i)$$

The final design weights are computed as:

$DS = NR * BW$; for the mailing sample
 $DS = BW$; for the panel sample

3) Post-stratification adjustments

The 2022 American Community Survey (ACS) data from the United States Census Bureau was used for post-

stratification adjustments.

The final weighting adjustments were made is to standardize weights so they sum to the actual population surveyed based on the following criteria:

- Region by gender
- Region by age
- Race/Ethnicity
- Income
- County

The weighted data set is designed to provide data that can be generalized to the targeted population. The population size reflected in the final data set is 6,164,362.

Limitations

Due to the use of a partly non-probability sample in the sampling design, it is important to use caution when assessing significant differences between subgroups in the survey. Margins of error (which are based on the assumptions of a random probability sample and normality) are approximated and as a result variance statistics may be underestimated.

Methodology

Response Rates and Sampling Error

The overall survey response rate for the ABS sample was 20% in 2024 which is inline with 2023. The survey margin of error among the probability (ABS) sample is +/- 1.3% at 95% confidence. The table below shows the ABS margin of error within each Target Zero Region.

Methodology

Presentation of Results

All results presented in this report are based on the final weighted dataset to reflect the overall population of the state. The exceptions to this are the demographic questions which are presented using unweighted data. Comparisons to the population (using data from the American Community Survey) are provided for demographic questions wherever possible to allow for comparisons between the final unweighted sample distribution compared to the population.

Missing Values

Respondents were provided an opportunity to skip any question they did not want to answer in the survey by providing a “don’t know” or “no answer” response. While the item level non-response is relatively low for most questions (in the low single digits) please note that the percentages reported in the tables and charts in this report reflect the percentages of valid responses, with “don’t know” and “no answer” responses excluded from the calculations.



Summary



SUMMARY

USE OF PUBLIC ROADS

- Three-quarters of respondents in Washington drive a motor vehicle daily and 30% walk or jog on public roads daily, while 18% ride a bicycle on public roads and 21% use public transportation once a month or more.

DRIVING HABITS

- The most-driven vehicles are cars (52%), SUVs (29%), and pickup trucks (10%). Overall, 14% of respondents in the state have driven a motorcycle in the last five years.
- Among those who have driven a motorcycle in the last five years, 50% said it was for recreational purchases. 40% said it was for both commuting and recreation.
- Over four in five respondents (82%) reported completing a driver's education class.

DRIVING HISTORY

- Overall, 8% of respondents reported being in 1 or more accidents in the past 12 months that they perceived to be not their fault, whereas 4% of respondents reported that they had been in 1 or more accidents in the past 12 months they perceived to be their fault.

PEDESTRIANS AND BICYCLISTS

- In the past 6 months, pedestrians and bicyclists have most often experienced drivers not stopping or going too fast (56%), a lack of sidewalks or damaged sidewalks (56%), or drivers turning without looking for them (43%).
- The most common situations that drivers have experienced around pedestrians and bicyclists include pedestrians not using marked crosswalks (68%), bicyclists being in the road (59%), and pedestrians or bicyclists using phones, ear pods, or headsets (56%).

SEAT BELT USE

- Over nine in ten (93%) respondents said they always wear a seat belt in a vehicle within a few miles of their home.
- By comparison, 94% always wear a seat belt in a vehicle many miles away from their home, and 77% always wear a seat belt when in the backseat of a vehicle.

SUMMARY

DRIVING BEHAVIORS

- During the past 12 months, less than one in twenty (4%) of respondents said they had driven a vehicle under the influence of alcohol and 3% under the influence of cannabis.
- One in three (33%) reported driving 10 mph over the speed limit sometimes in the past 30 days, while 9% said they usually drove 10 mph over the speed limit and 3% said they always drove 10 mph over the speed limit in the past 30 days..
- 49% of respondents said that they've driven while reading or looking at their cell phone and 37% have driven while manually typing or interacting with their cell phone with their hand in the past 30 days.
- Among those in a relevant situation in the past 30 days, 71% of respondents asked someone who was not using a seat belt to use a seat belt. 48% have acted to prevent someone who was perhaps too impaired to drive safely from driving, 53% have asked someone who speeding or driving aggressively to slow down, and 55% have asked a driver who was using their cell phone or who was distracted to focus on driving.

DRIVING RULES

- More than nine in ten (92%) respondents reported having a family rule about always wearing a seat belt, 85% about never driving after consuming alcohol, and 79% about never driving after consuming cannabis. Only 40% of respondents reported having a family rule about never exceeding the speed limit.
- Among those with an employer, 54% said their employer has a policy about never driving after consuming alcohol, 52% about never driving after consuming cannabis, and 47% about always using a seat belt.

SUMMARY

GENERAL SAFETY

- Overall, 13% of respondents believe that it was very or extremely dangerous to drive a motor vehicle on public roads, 44% of respondents to ride a bicycle on public roads, 29% to walk or jog on public roads, and 12% to use public transportation.
- More than four in five (85%) respondents believe that it is very or extremely dangerous when drivers type or interact with their cell phones while driving, while 81% believe that it is very or extremely dangerous when drivers read or look at their cell phones while driving.
- Over one-third (35%) of respondents believe that it is very or extremely dangerous to speed 10 mph or more over the speed limit, 65% when drivers hold and talk on cell phones, 49% to drive shortly (within an hour) after consuming 1 drink of alcohol, 71% to drive shortly (within an hour) after consuming 2 or more drinks of alcohol, 63% to drive shortly (within an hour) after consuming cannabis, and 62% to drive after using prescription or over-the-counter drugs with side effects.
- Respondents believe the most common risks to motorcycle riders' safety includes drivers engaging in distracted driving (texting, calling, eating, etc.) (28%); drivers not looking for motorcyclists or checking their blind spots (24%); drivers not adhering to safety or traffic laws (14%); and drivers driving too fast (13%).
- Many respondents in the state believe that it is not at all likely or only slightly likely someone in their community would get caught by the police for driving while using a cell phone (53%), driving 10 mph or more over the speed limit (44%), driving under the influence of alcohol (33%), driving under the influence of cannabis (44%), or driving while not wearing a seat belt (52%).

SUMMARY

DRIVING EXPECTATIONS

- Nine in ten respondents said the people who are important to them would disapprove of them driving after consuming alcohol, and nearly nine in ten (88%) respondents said the people who are important to them would disapprove of them driving after consuming cannabis.
- Similarly, more than four in five (84%) respondents said that those important to them would somewhat or strongly approve if they asked someone who was not using a seat belt to use a seat belt.
- 94% of respondents reported that those important to them would somewhat or strongly approve if they acted to prevent someone from driving who was perhaps too impaired to drive safely.
- 79% of respondents reported that those important to them would somewhat or strongly approve if they asked a driver who was speeding or driving aggressively to slow down.
- 83% of respondents reported that those important to them would somewhat or strongly approve if they asked a driver who was using their cell phone or who was distracted to focus on driving.

COMMUNITY PERCEPTIONS

- Nearly nine in ten (89%) respondents believe that people in their community usually or always wear a seat belt.
- 43% believe that people usually or always drive 10 mph or more over the speed limit.
- 12% believe that people usually or always drive after consuming alcohol.

DRIVING AND CELL PHONE USE

- More than half of respondents said it would be very easy to never talk on a cell phone while holding it and driving (61%) or never read or manually type on a cell phone while driving (59%).

SUMMARY

DRIVING SAFETY

- Overall, four in five (81%) respondents would be very or extremely comfortable asking someone to use a seat belt.
- 76% would be very or extremely comfortable acting to prevent someone who is going to drive who is perhaps too impaired to drive safely,
- 60% would be very or extremely comfortable asking someone who is speeding or driving aggressively to slow down, and 68% would be comfortable asking a driver who is using their cell phone or who is distracted to focus on driving.

TRAFFIC SAFETY

- Over half (59%) of respondents strongly agree with the statement, “the only acceptable number of deaths and serious injuries on our roadways should be zero” and three-quarters (76%) slightly or strongly agree.
- Four in five (82%) strongly support law enforcement enforcing driving under the influence of alcohol, 73% driving through a red light or not stopping at a stop sign, and 69% driving under the influence of cannabis.

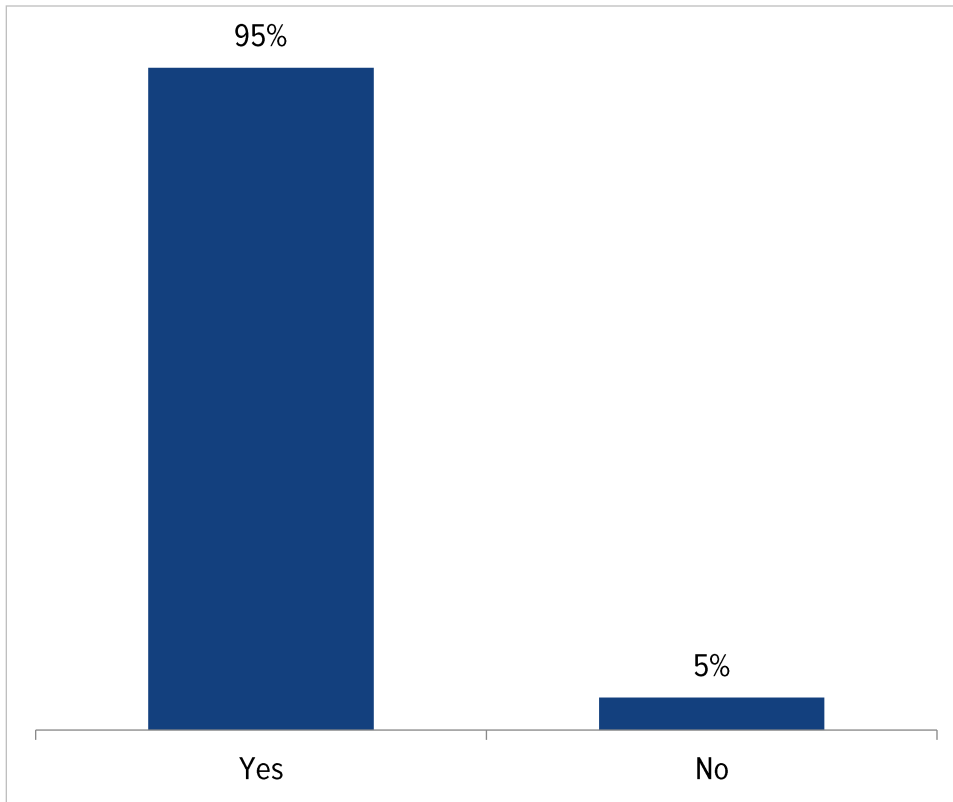

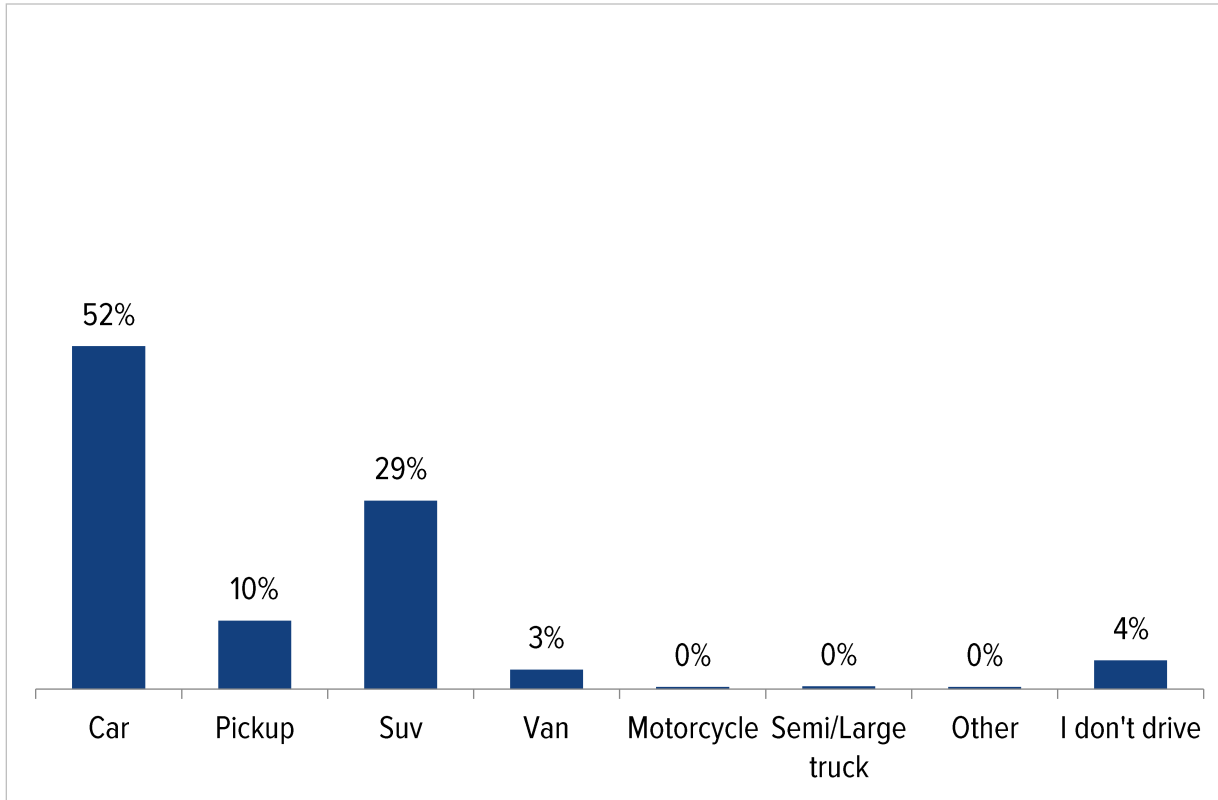
Do you have a valid driver's license?

What type of vehicle do you drive most often?



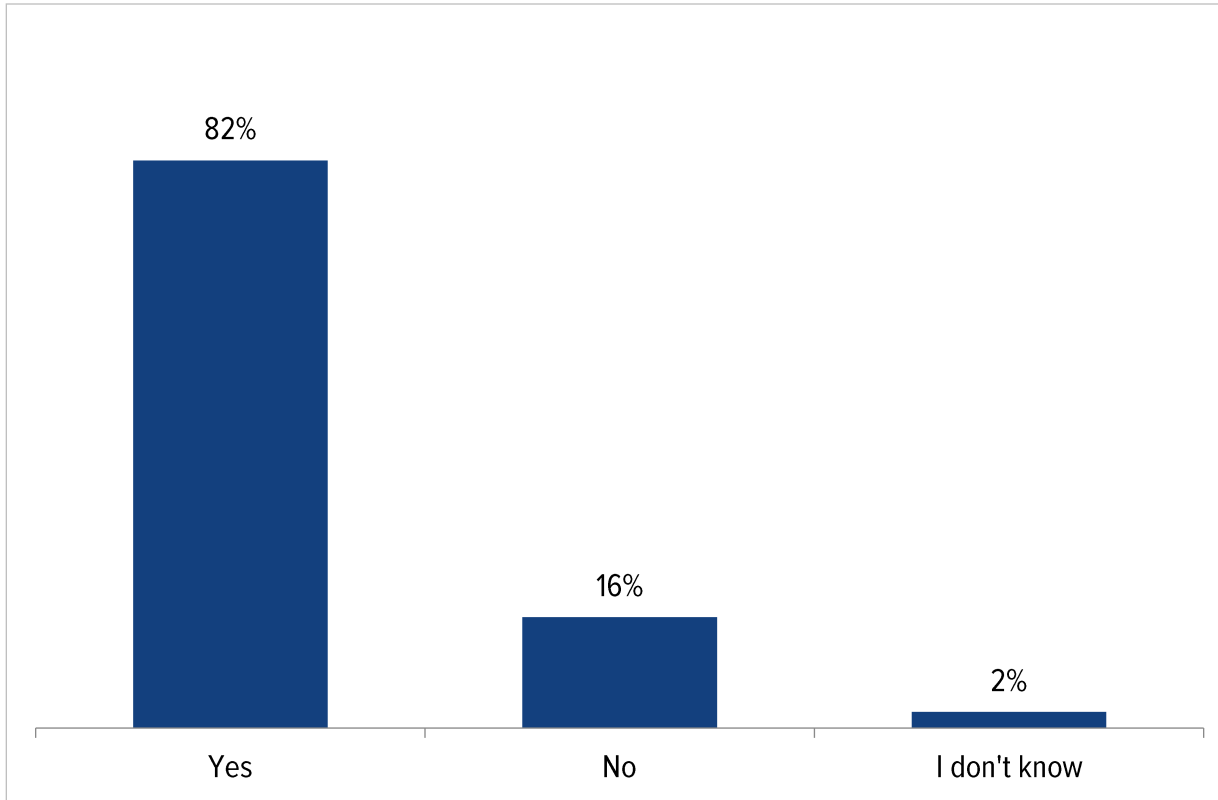

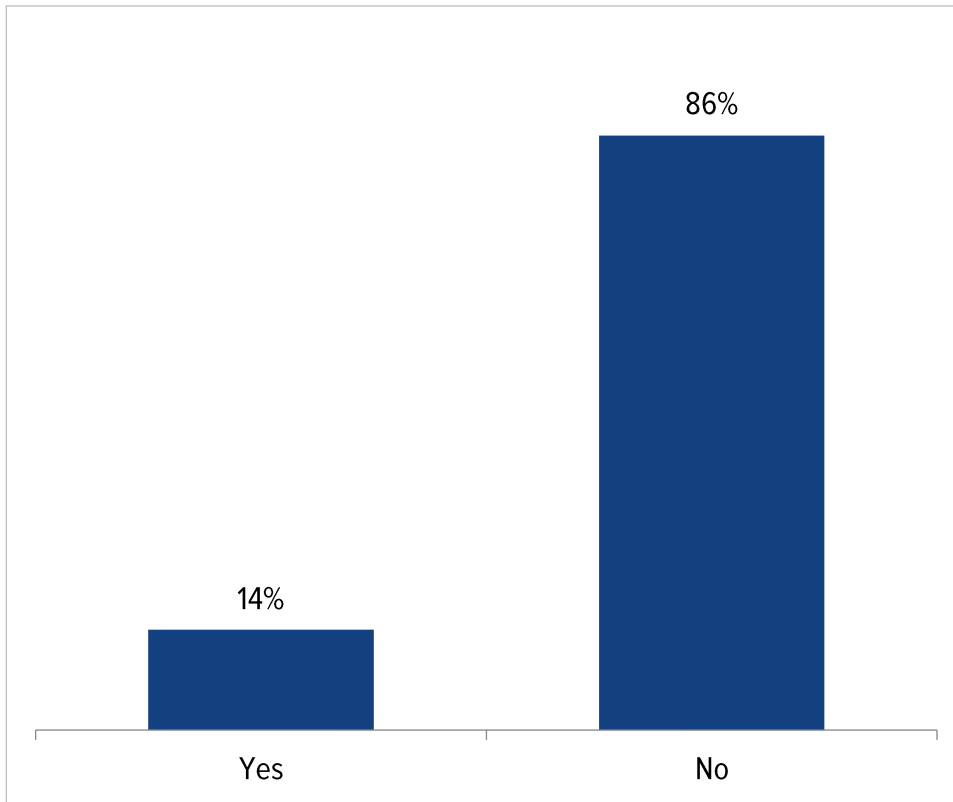

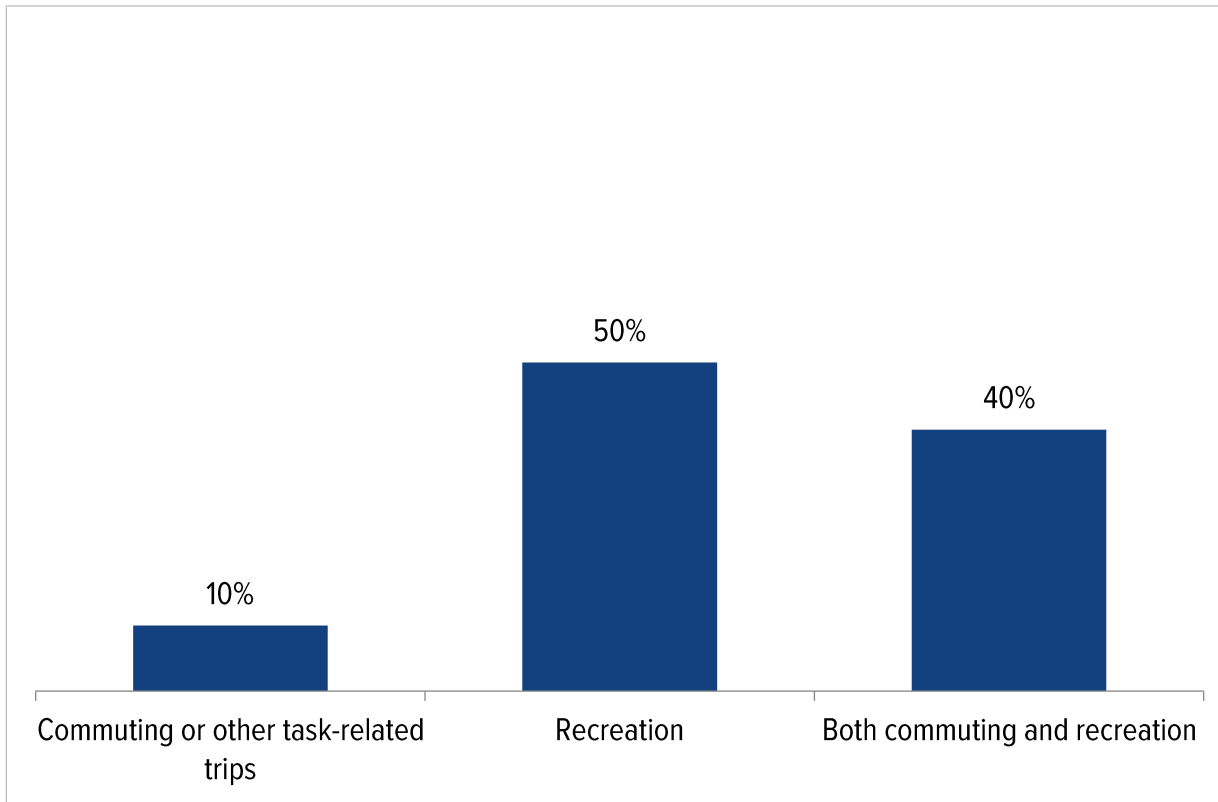
Have you driven a motorcycle in the previous five years?

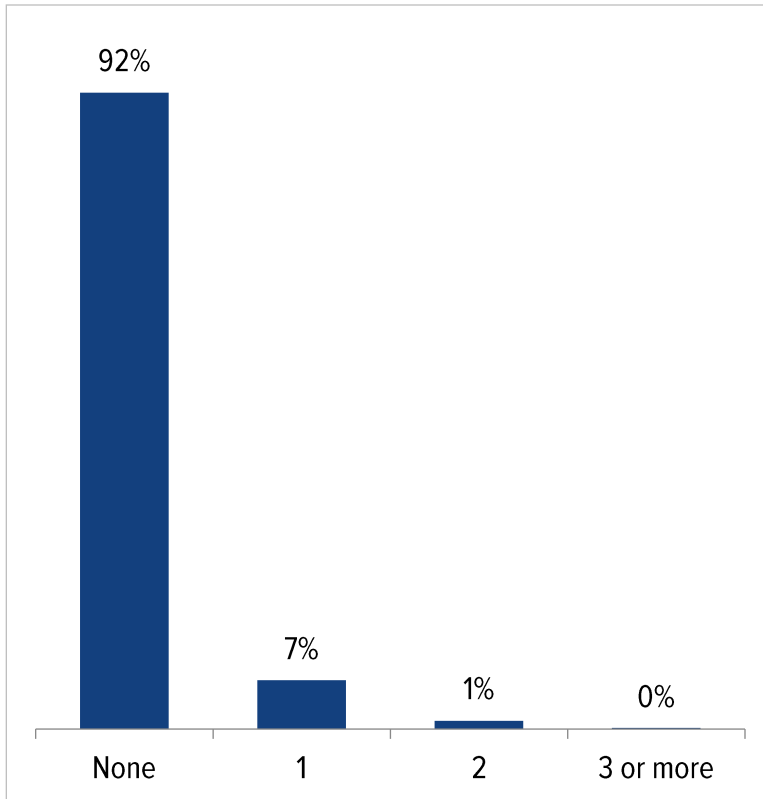

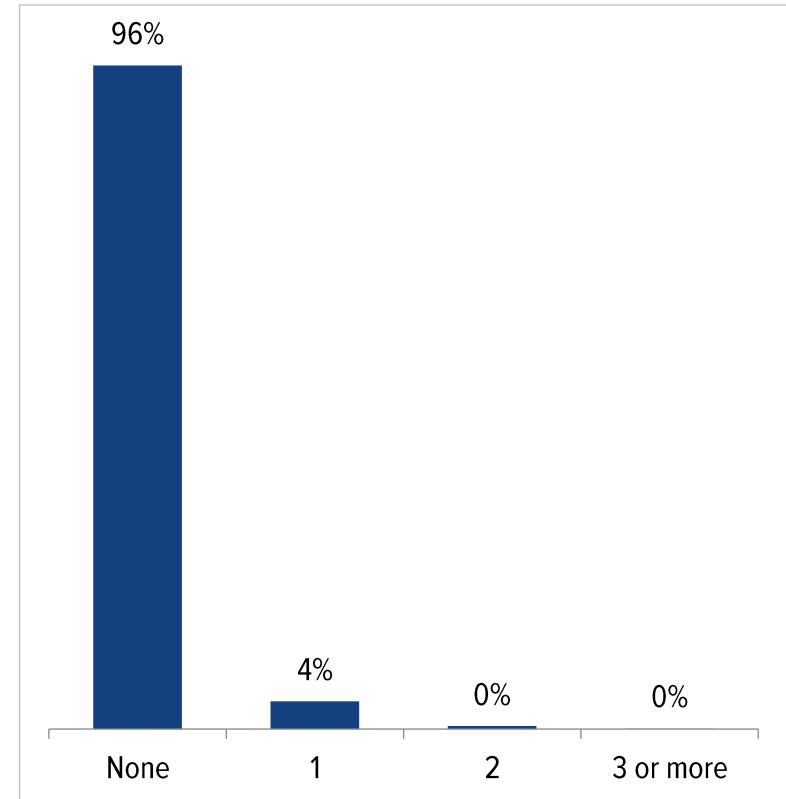

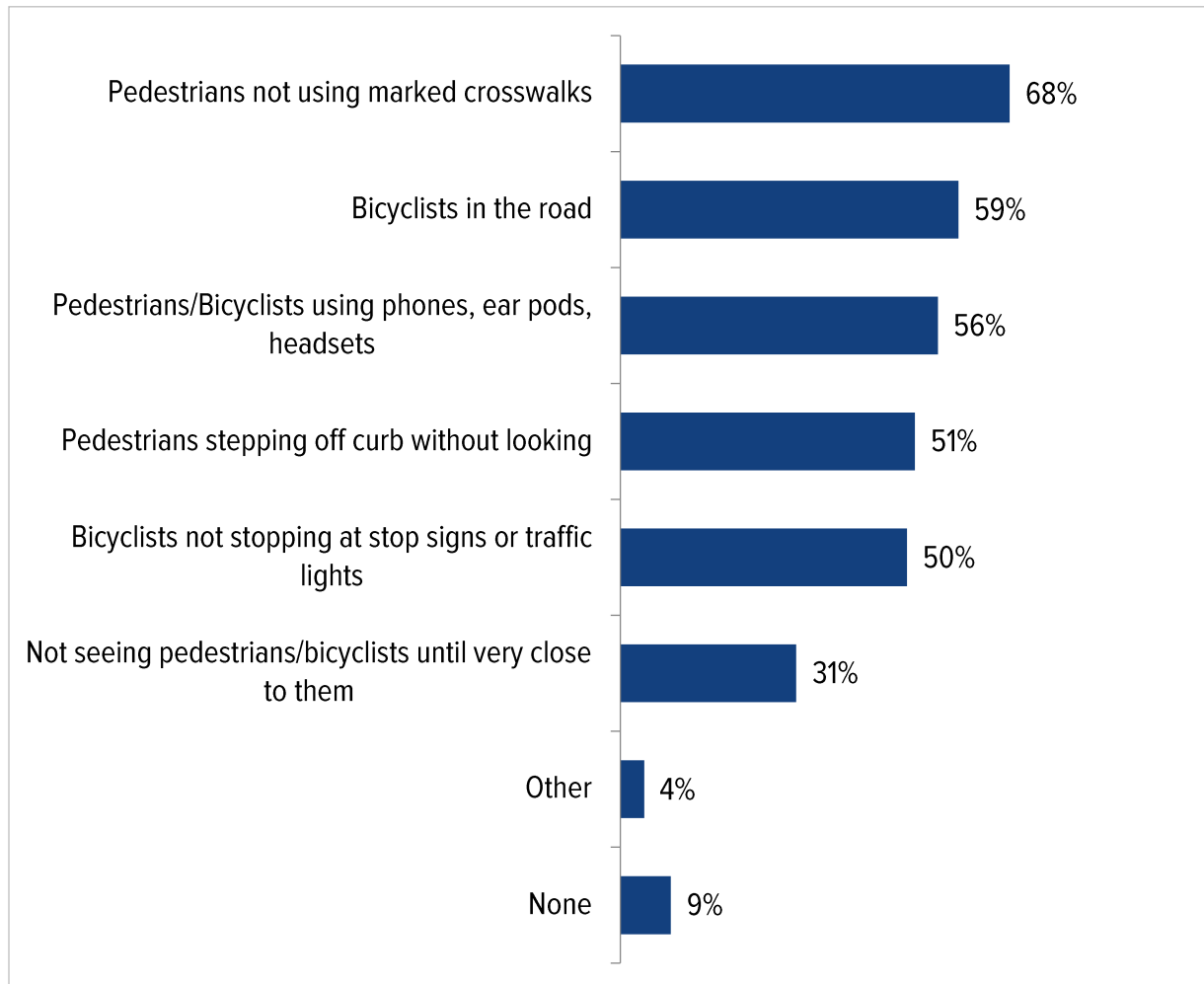

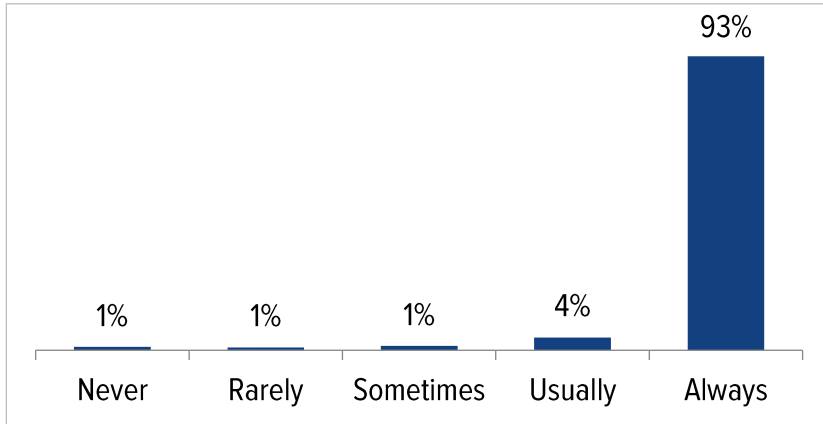

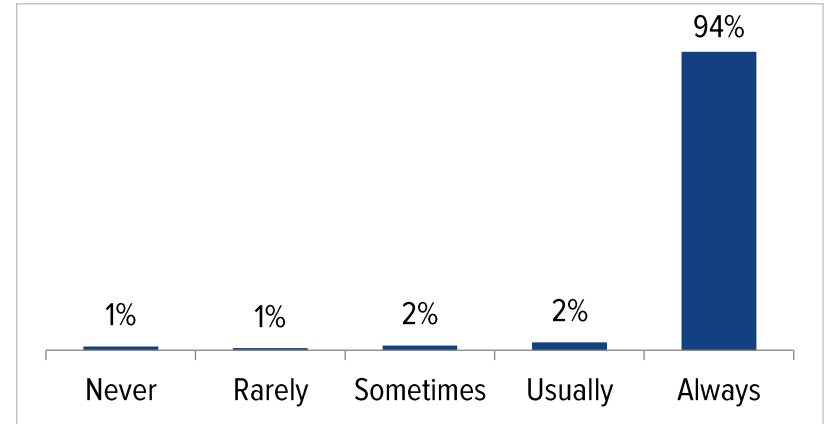

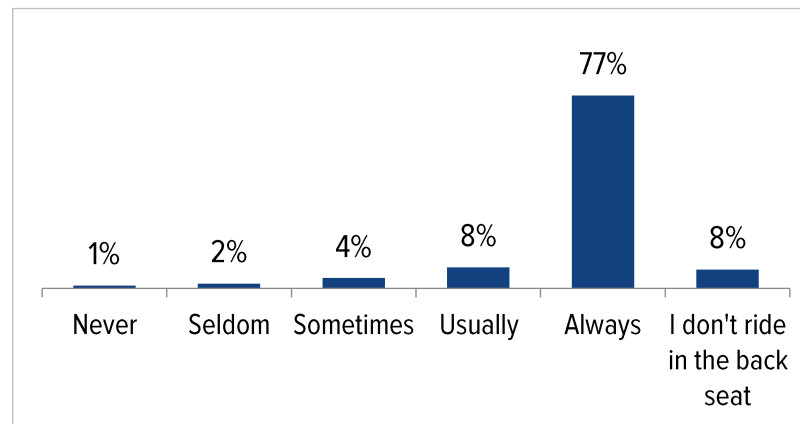

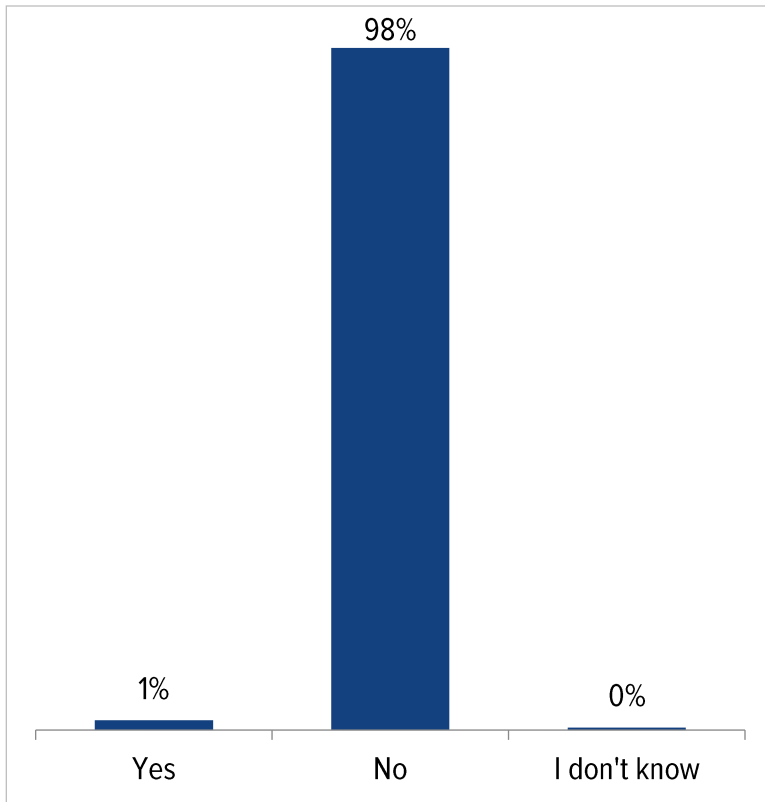

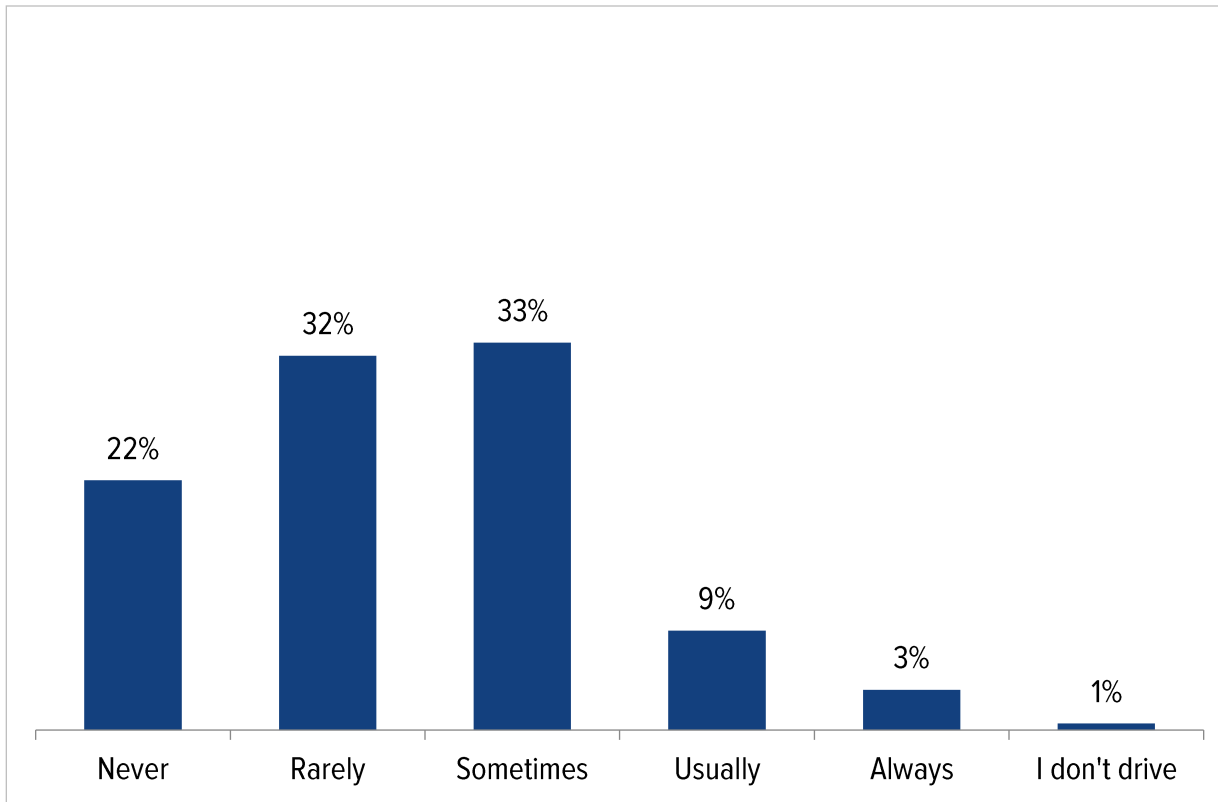

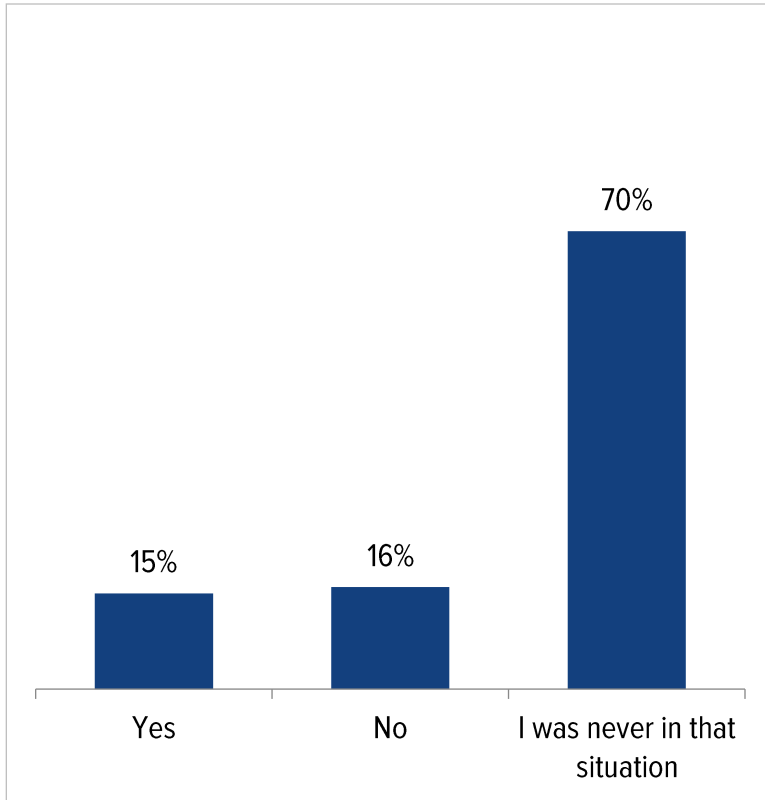

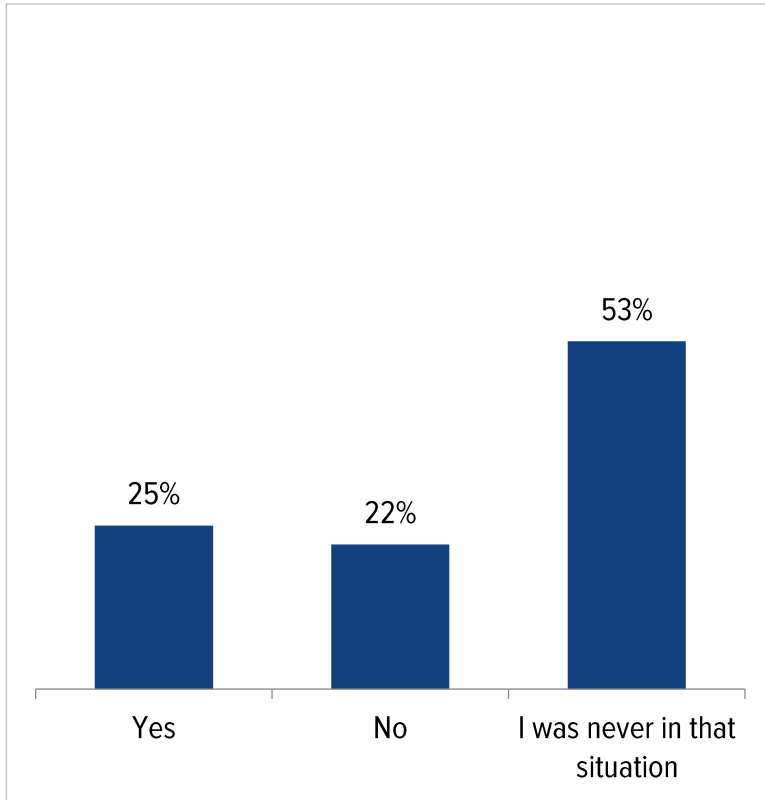

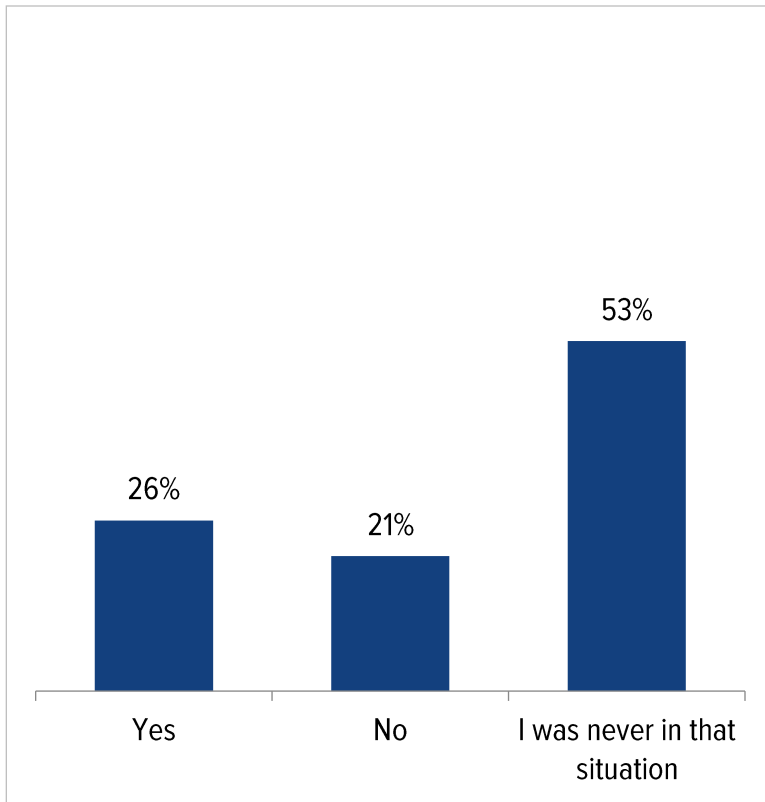

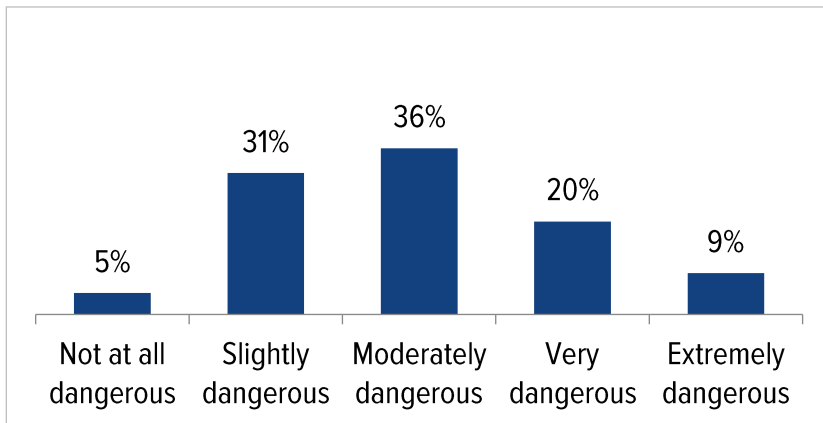

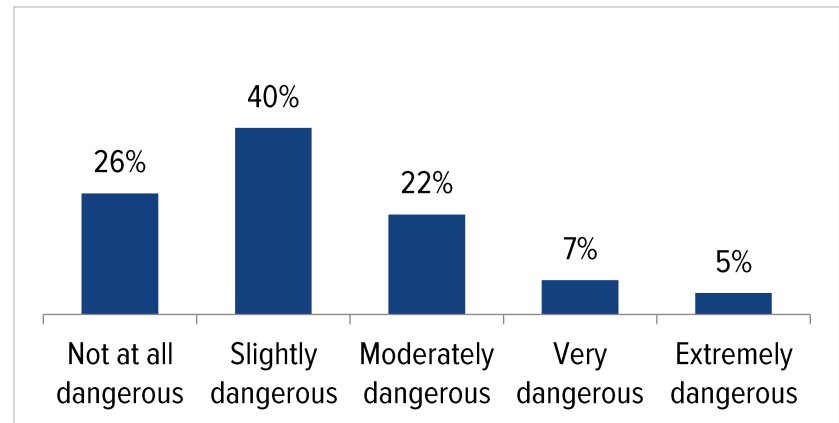

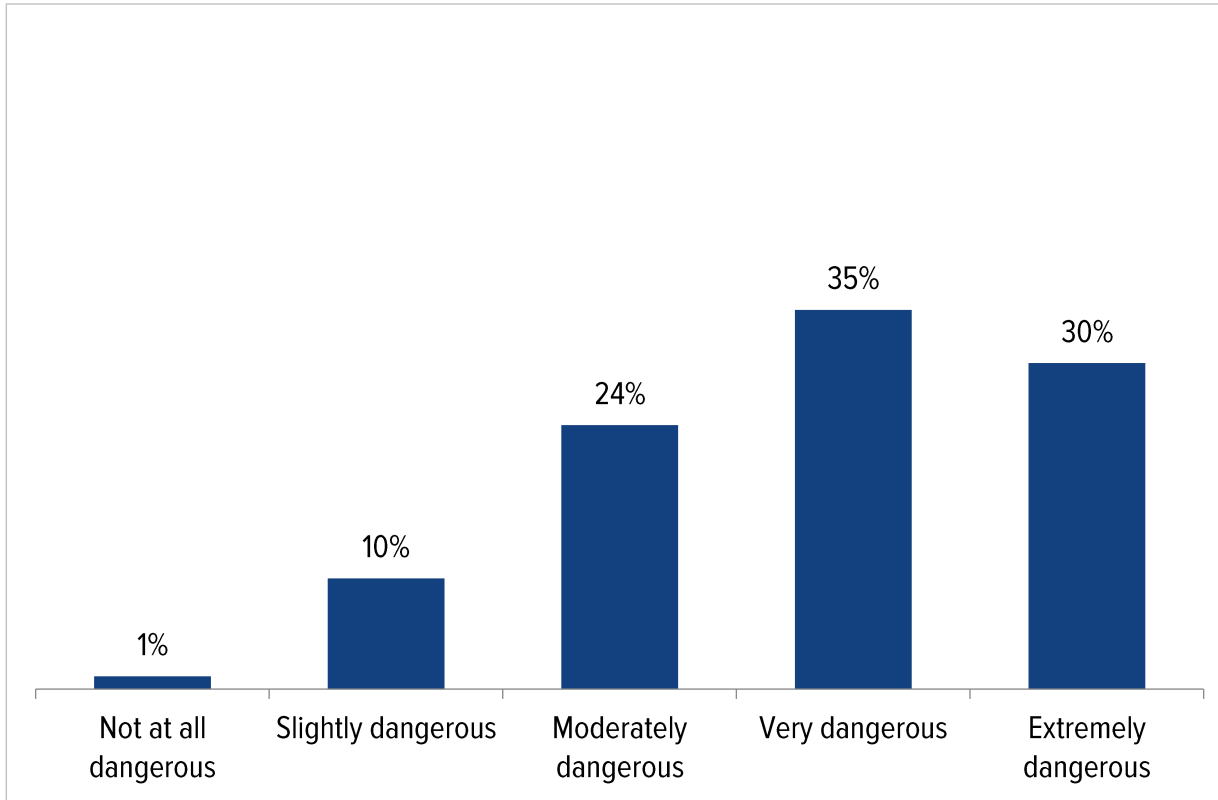

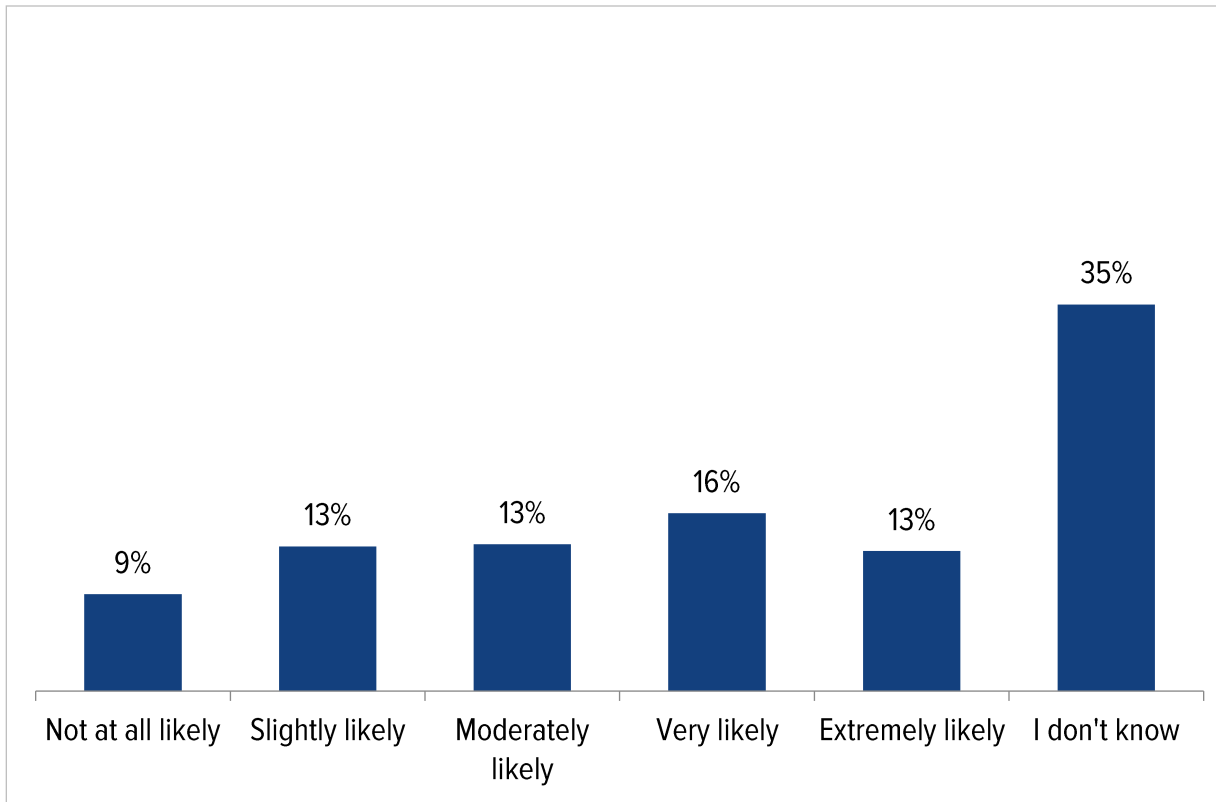

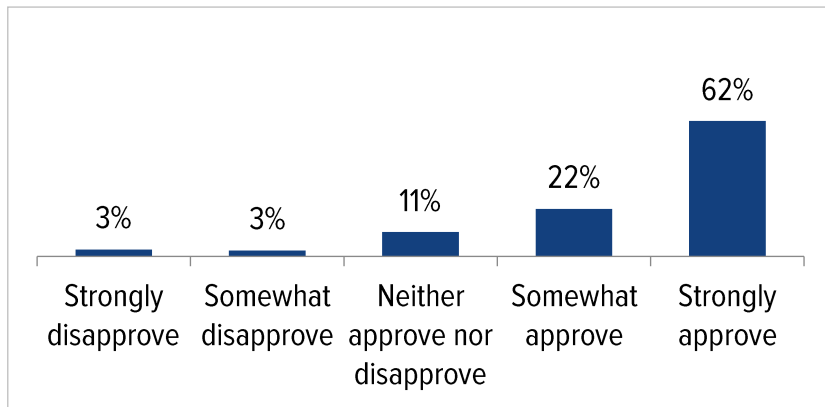

How much do you believe people who are important to you would approve or disapprove of the following behaviors? (Overall %)

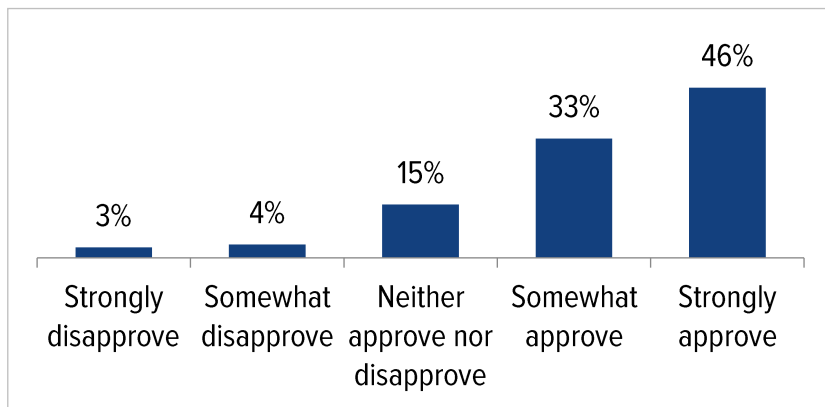
Asking someone who was not using a seat belt to use a seat belt



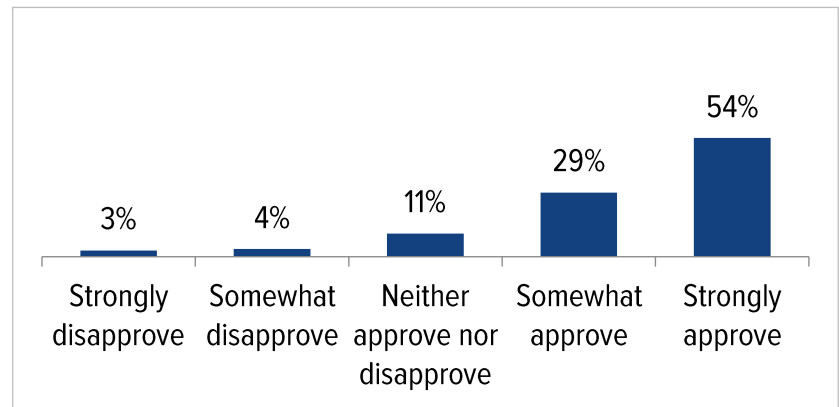
Taking some action to prevent someone who was going to drive who was perhaps too impaired to drive safely

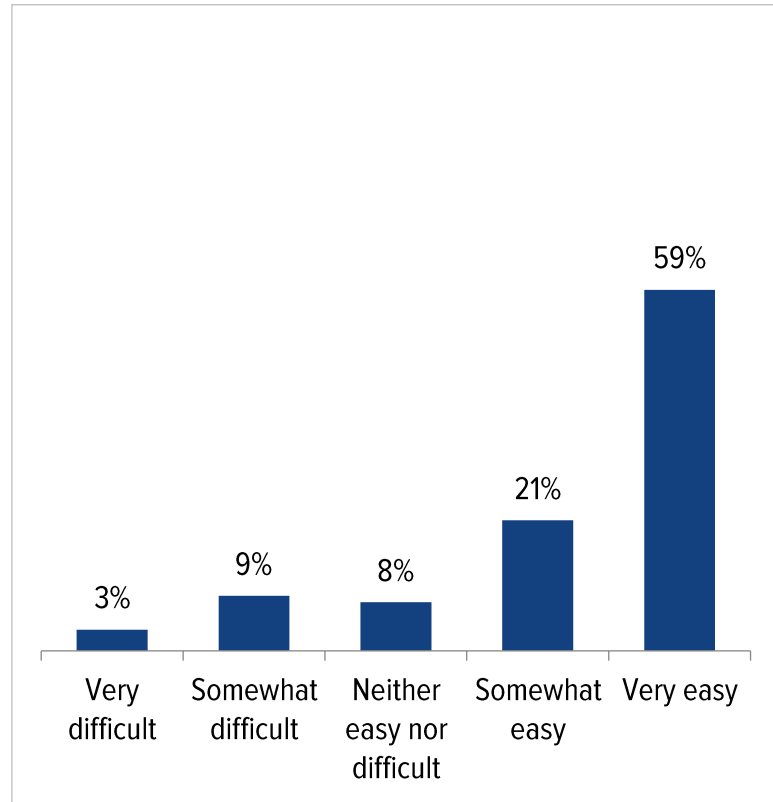

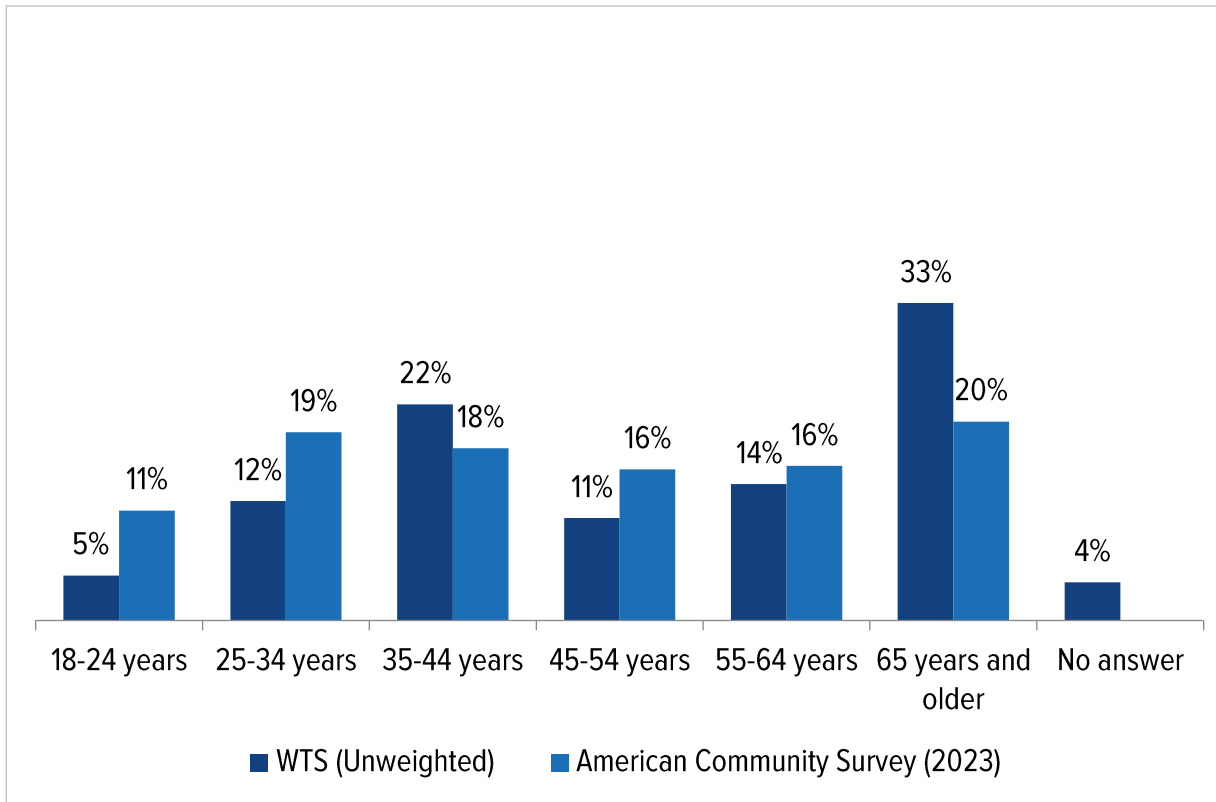

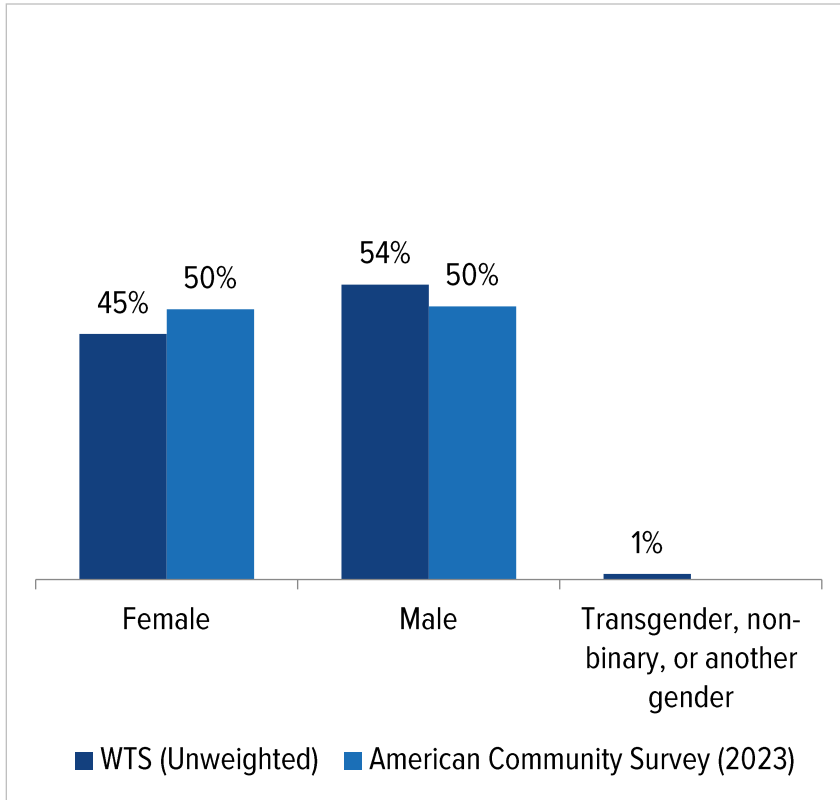
Age Categories (by Gender, Ethnicity, Race)

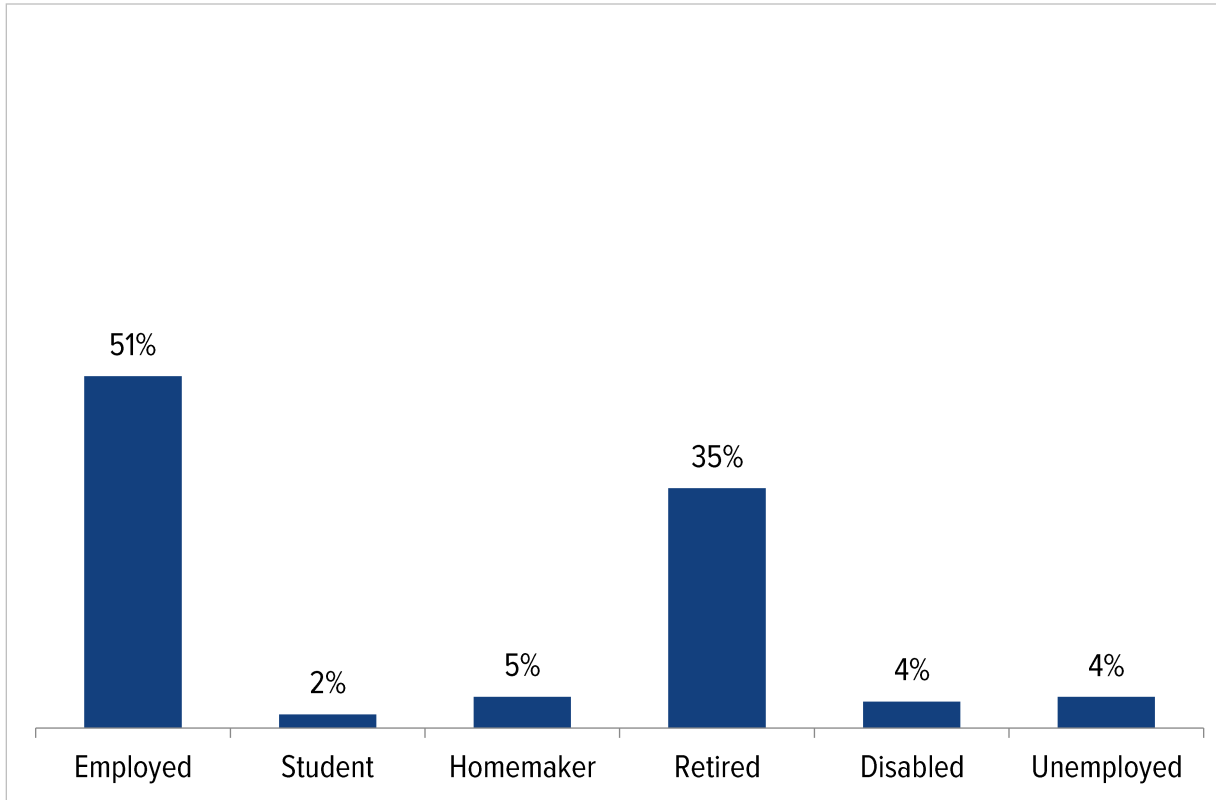

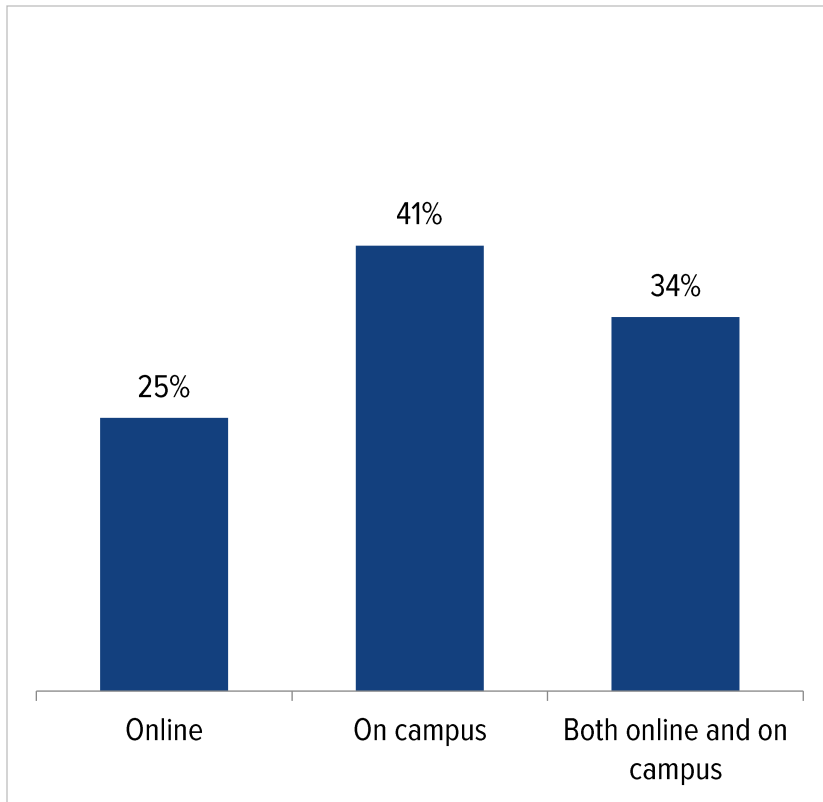

Do you attend school online or on campus? (Overall % and by Gender, Age, Ethnicity, Race)

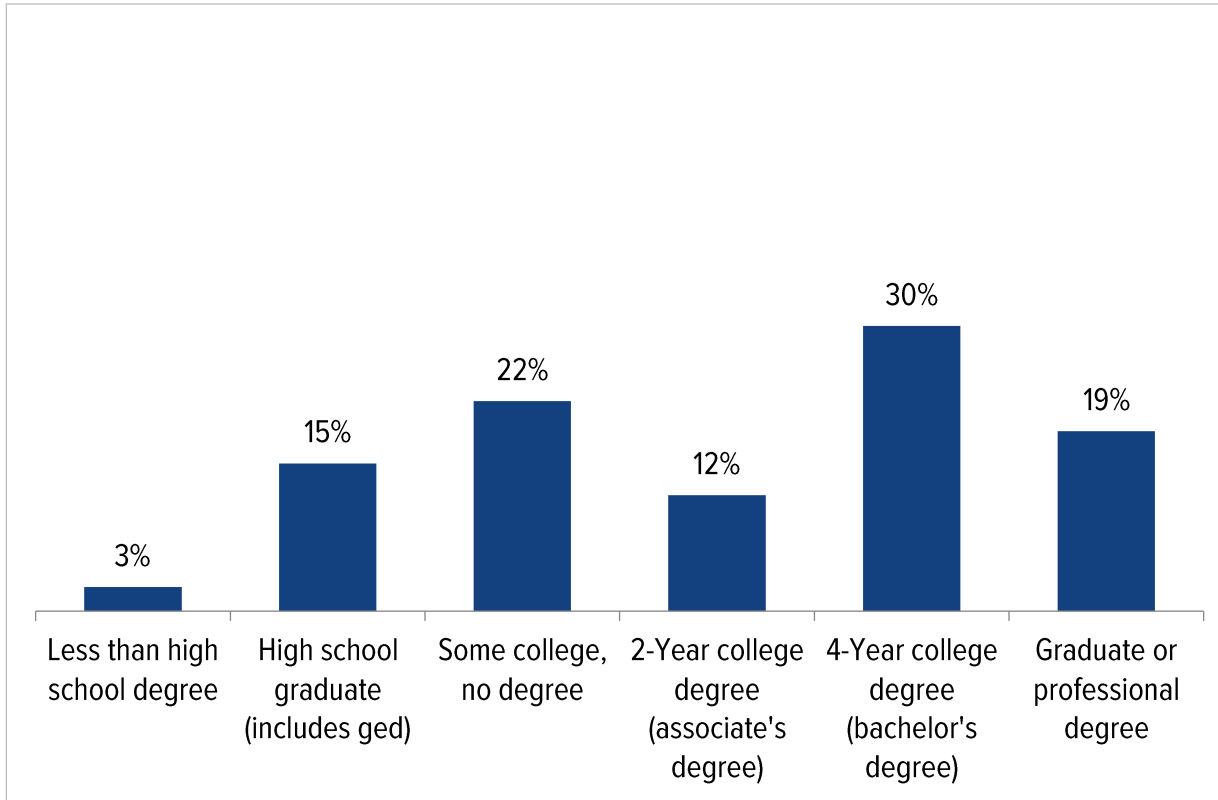

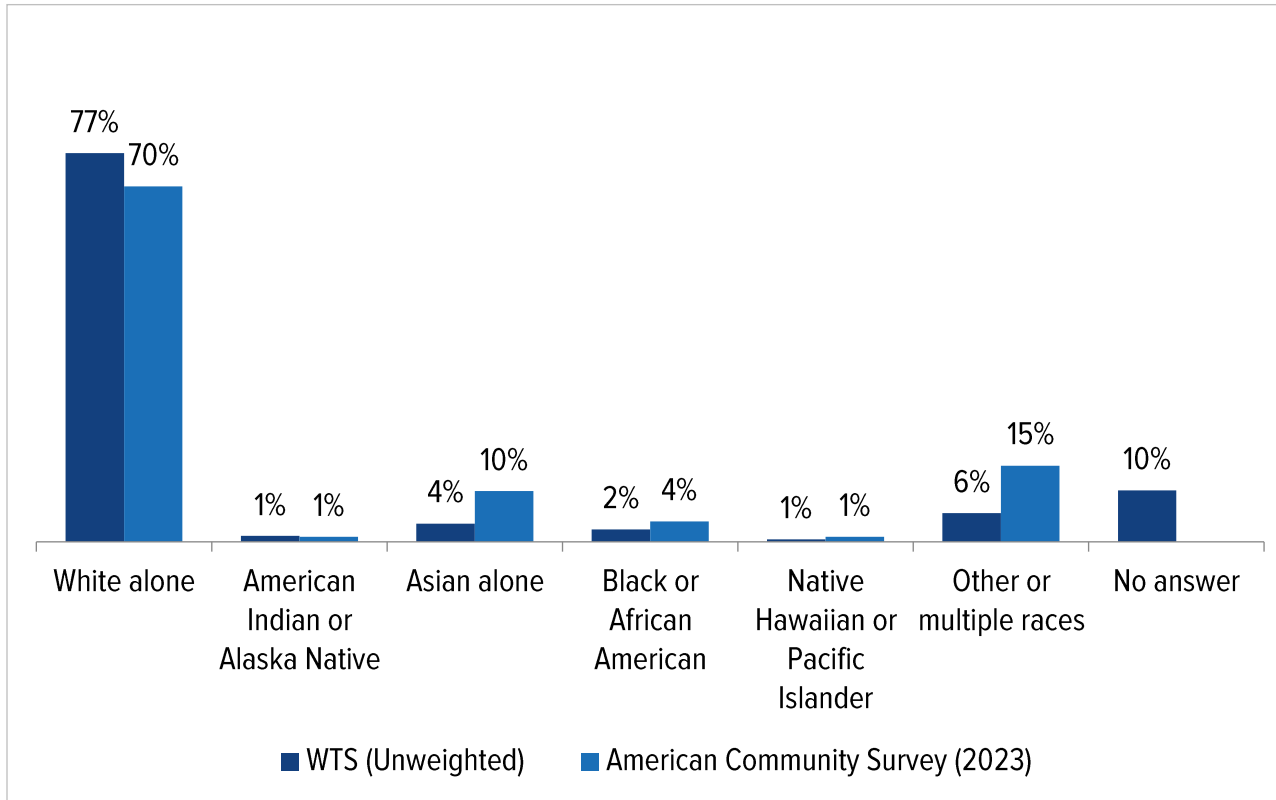

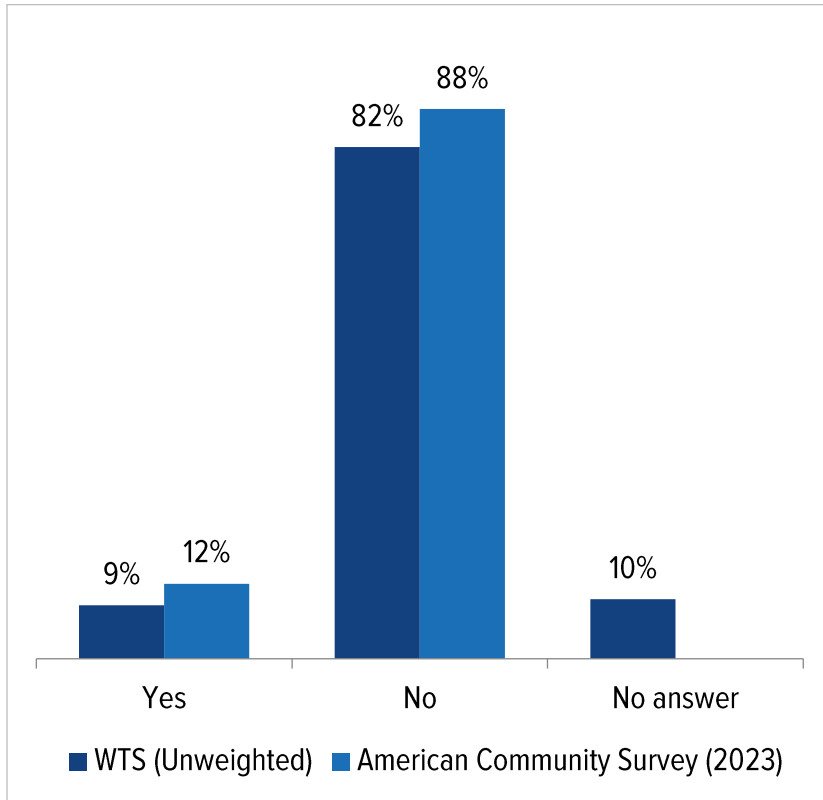

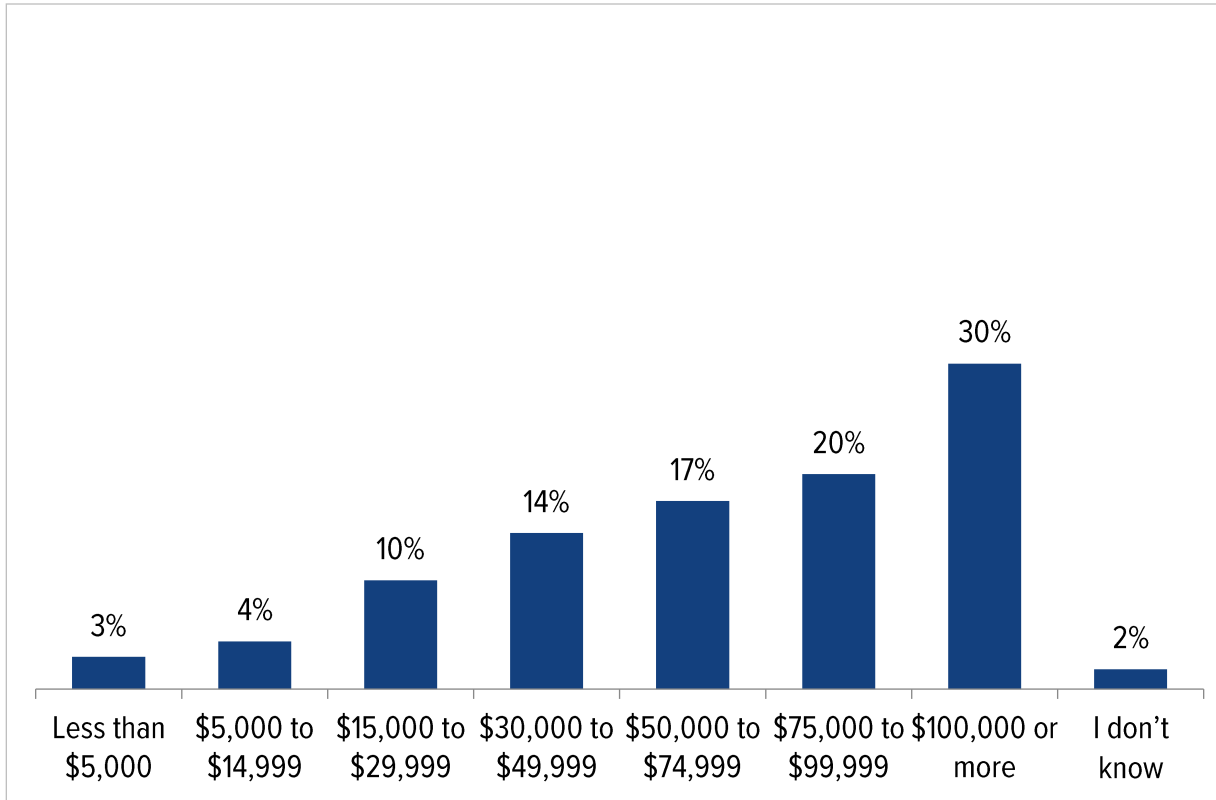

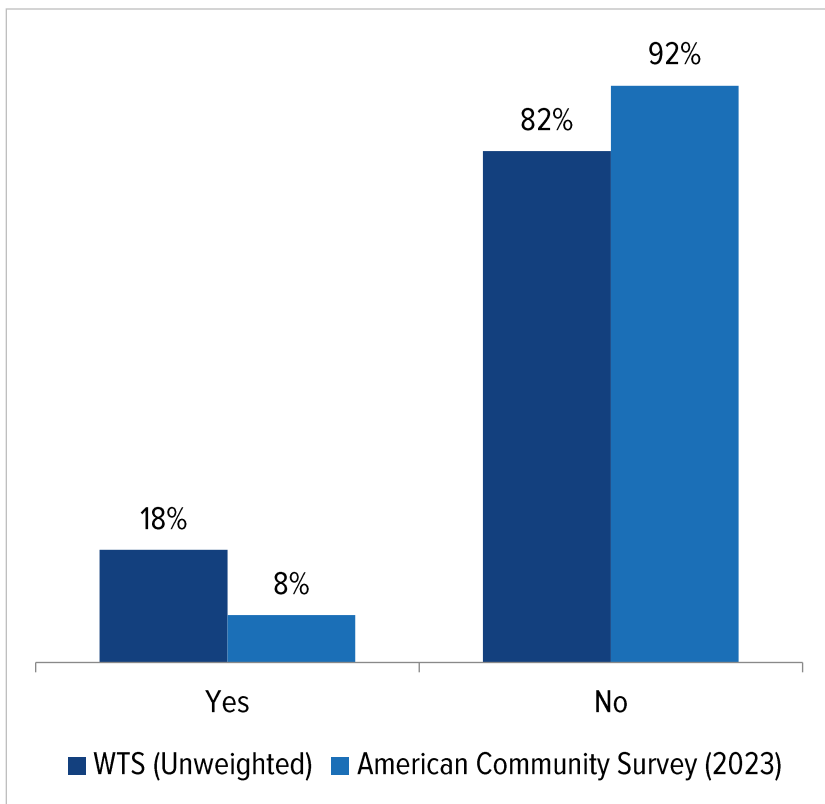

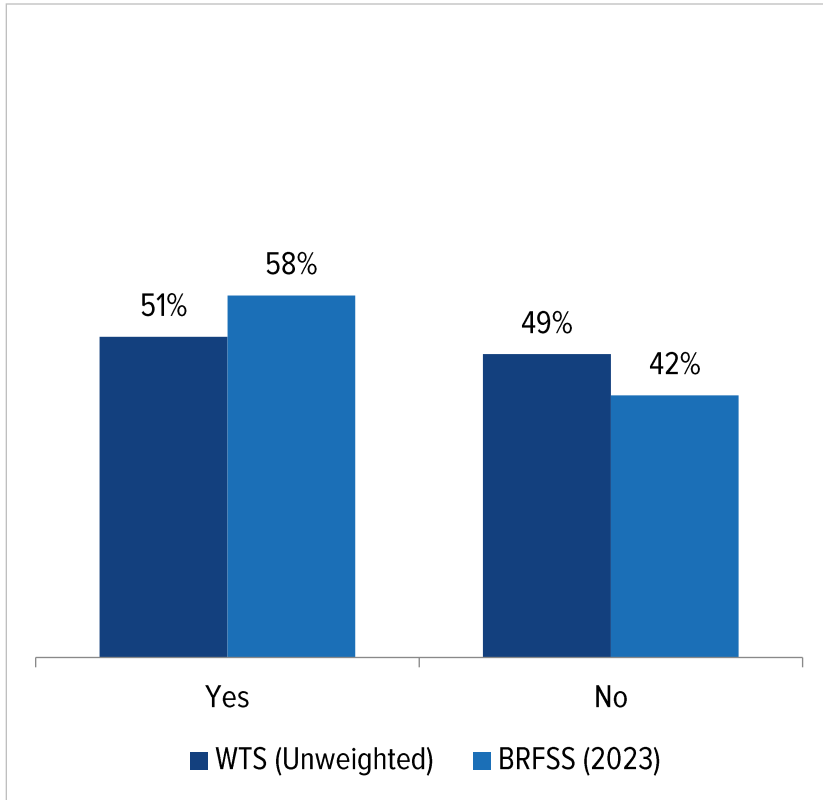

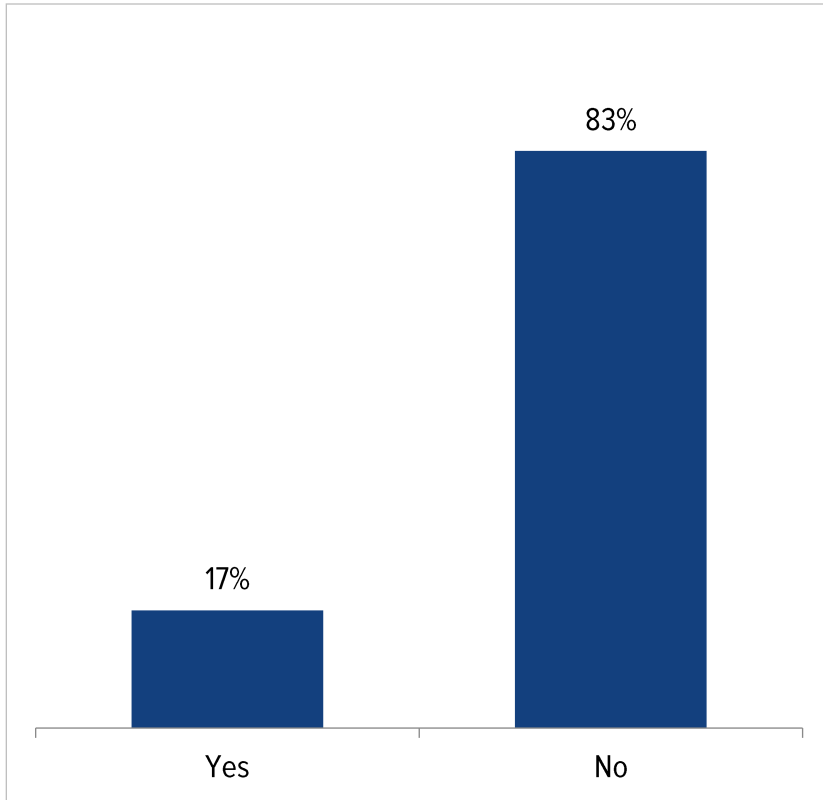
