






ORDER

NO. 25700-A-1644

The Washington State Supreme Court in October 2023 requested that the Washington State Bar Association ("WSBA") Council on Public Defense ("CPD") review a newly released National Public Defense Workload Study ("The Rand Study") and provide recommendations, if any, to the Court.

Adopted by the WA Supreme Court in 2025

Previously

- From 1984 until 2025, the public defense standards recommended limits:
 - ▶ 150 felony cases per defense attorney, per year, in Superior Court
 - ▶ 300-400 cases per defense attorney, per year, in District Court

Standards of Indigent Defense

- B. <u>Adult Felony Cases—Class A</u>. Each attorney representing a defendant accused of class A felony as defined in RCW 9A.20.020 shall meet the following requirements:
 - i. The minimum requirements set forth in Section 1; and
 - ii. Either:
 - a. has served two years as a prosecutor; or
- b. has served two years as a public defender; or two years in a private criminal practic
- iii. Has been trial counsel alone or with other counsel and handled a significant portic the trial in three felony cases that have been submitted to a jury.
- C. <u>Adult Felony Cases—Class B Violent Offense</u>. Each attorney representing a defer accused of a Class B violent offense as defined in RCW 9A.20.020 shall meet the followin requirements.
 - i. The minimum requirements set forth in Section 1; and
 - ii. Either;
 - a. has served one year as a prosecutor; or
 - b. has served one year as a public defender; or one year in a private criminal practice:


To have 4.89 Superior Court attorneys

- ▶ \$773, 430.00 for Superior Court only attorneys





Contract defense attorneys

Rate the county pays for Superior Court cases: \$175 per hour

Rate the county pays for District Court cases: \$150 per hour

A true example-LWOP murder case

- ▶ In 2024, I had a LWOP murder case.
- ▶ At the time, the hourly rate was \$125 per hour
- ▶ I billed Mason County approximately \$57,000 for the one year I had the case.
- ▶ I also had a second attorney work with me from the County.
 - ▶ Total cost to the county: Approximately: \$114,000 total cost to the county

Standards of Indigent Defense

Standard 5. Administrative Costs

Standard 5.1. [Reserved.]

Standard 5.2.

A. Contracts for public defense services should provide for or include administrative costs associated with providing legal representation. These costs should include but are not limited to travel; telephones; law library, including electronic legal research; financial accounting; case management systems; computers and software; office space and supplies; training; meeting the reporting requirements imposed by these standards; and other costs necessarily incurred in the day-to-day management of the contract.

B. Public defense attorneys shall have (1) access to an office that accommodates confidential meetings with clients and (2) a postal address, and adequate telephone services to ensure prompt response to client contact.

[Adopted effective October 1, 2012.]
